KDBH Neighbourhood Forum Update

We are delighted to confirm that the KDBH Neighbourhood Forum has been successful in its bid for community infrastructure funding (commonly known as NCIL) from Solihull Council. The award of £10,000 provided equally from Dorridge, Bentley Heath and Knowle Wards enables the Forum to continue its important work and press ahead with several community engagement projects including:

- 1. Resident consultation on prioritisation of Community Infrastructure Projects.
- Extensive consultation and engagement with the Community following the publication of the Inspectors' recommendations on the Local Plan.
- 3. Updating the Neighbourhood Plan following approval of the Solihull Local Plan.
- 4. Substantially increasing Forum membership including younger members
- 5. Review and refresh of Community Actions set out in the Neighbourhood Plan.
- Creation of a masterplan for the KDBH area (including highways, parking, cycle routes, pedestrian routes etc) in association with residents, residents' organisations and Solihull Council. Congratulations are also extended to the other successful NCIL bidders in our area:

Government's Levelling-Up and Regeneration Bill: Reforms to National Planning Policy

The Government is currently proposing changes to national planning policy which could have significant implications for the two large housing sites proposed in Knowle - at Hampton Road (198 houses) and at the 'Arden Triangle', between Station Road and Warwick Road (660 houses). The changes relate to housing development on protected green belt land and to housing densities. Although specifically relevant to the Knowle sites the outcome of the proposed changes may have far-reaching consequences for the entire KDBH area as they directly affect green belt land and are aimed at housing densities residents have previously expressed as too high for our area. These sites are still being assessed by Government Inspectors as part of the Solihull Local Plan Review and to date they have signalled that they consider these sites are suitable and appropriate for housing. That is despite residents not knowing what will happen to the proposed relocation of Arden Academy, provision of a new Primary School or the future of Knowle FC.

The changes in national planning policy are expected to be announced very shortly. If confirmed, they are likely to present a final opportunity for the KDBH Neighbourhood Forum to make further representations to the Inspectors before they issue their recommendations to the Council. We are aware that some bodies, such as the Council for the Preservation of Rural England (CPRE) and Berkswell residents' organisations, are lobbying for some housing sites in their area to be dropped.

The Forum will shortly be issuing more of the background to this together with a consultation document for residents to have a say on various options about how they should respond.

Street Watch

We are pleased to report that Street Watch (SW) has been fully revived again after reduced activity since Covid-19. This is timely with recent burglary and car theft in the village. We believe that SW provides a definite benefit but, on its own, is not a sufficient deterrent to the determined criminals we face. All of us can play a part by making Dorridge a place of higher risk and lower reward to criminals by doing some of the following things:

- 1. Walk our local streets as much as possible, acknowledging everyone. If anyone looks suspicious make a record of their descriptions in case a burglary is subsequently reported.
- 2. Similarly, note down details of vehicles/drivers which seem suspicious. Make them aware that they have been 'clocked'.
- 3. If an alarm sounds, if possible, quickly go to the property and observe from the road. Many will be false alarms!
- If your security system has advised a definite entry to your house (cameras or multiple PIR triggers) let your Neighbourhood Watch WhatsApp Group know.
- 5. Encourage neighbours to join such Groups so they can respond in concert.
- 6. If you have not had recent security advice then seek it. If a thief will find it difficult to get into your rear garden and then difficult to get into your house and slow to find valuables with an alarm sounding all the while they may be put off and leave. The more thwarted attempts there are, the lower the rewards of coming to Dorridge will be.

Dorridge Day - Sunday the 10th of September

Please put this date in your diary because Dorridge Day will soon be upon us!

'What Is Dorridge Day?' - Initially it was known as the Dorridge Day Fete when it first started in 1974. It was organised by the Dorridge Day Village Hall Committee with proceeds of the Fete going to the Village Hall Building Fund and Scout and Guides. In 1980 Gordon Harvey was asked to take on the position of Chairman to represent Knowle and Dorridge Round Table and this is how it has continued to this day, albeit with someone new from Round Table taking the project management lead each year. In this way Dorridge Day has gone from strength to strength and is a hugely positive day for the local community.

This year's event will be held at Dorridge Park starting at 11:30 and will continue until 17:00. The first band is on stage at 11:30 and the second at 14:00 - there will be several dance groups between these music sets. There will be lots of family activities including inflatables and climbing with plenty of street food and two bars. The classic car parade from Knowle to the park will start at 11:45 and at 16:15 there will be a tug of war and to wrap up the afternoon at 16:45 there will be a much enjoyed water pistol fight!

Knowle Ramblers have approximately 75 members with the majority living in Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath. Each month we arrange two longer walks, normally between 7 and 9 miles, and within an hour's travelling time; and two short walks 4 to 6 miles, locally or within half an hour's travelling time. Many of the short walks finish somewhere specific for refreshment and food afterwards. On most of the long walks, walkers bring a packed lunch. Typically we have 10 to 20 members coming together to walk. In addition, every other month, a local amble of less than 3 miles, is arranged. Generally, for the long walks we meet in Bentley Heath to arrange car sharing, but for the short walks, car sharing is inappropriate.

In recent weeks we have enjoyed walks from the Tom O 'the Wood in Rowington, on Cannock Chase, from Chadwick End, and to Edgbaston. By the time this article is printed we will also have had our mid-summer walk and supper at Knowle, and a Friday evening walk from Dorridge.

We would be delighted to see you on one of our walks in July. Our plans include long walks (7 to 9 miles) on Sat 8 July and Sun 23 July, with a short walk at Hampton Lucy on Wednesday 5 July and another short walk (about 4.5) on Friday evening 14 July. Longer term we are planning our weekend away to Selworthy in Somerset (by Exmoor) in April 2024. Bamboo - Friend or Foe?

Are you thinking of planting bamboo in your garden? Perhaps you already have some. Before you go ahead and plant a clump, or a hedge, make sure you understand the nature of this plant. A bamboo hedge can provide privacy and is an effective screen from unsightly fences, but care must be exercised if the screen is not to become a nuisance and even a danger to property – belonging to you or your neighbours!

The well over 1000 different species can be divided into two types – clumping or running. Both have large rhizome (root) systems. The running variety sends out long rhizomes which can spread several meters underground, under walls, fences, paths and patios.

One way of preventing the spread is to plant the bamboo in a container or within a special membrane, but, unfortunately, this is not always done. If the bamboo spreads to neighbouring property it can cause disputes with neighbours, who may be reluctant to admit the scale of the problem and resent the cost implication of limiting growth or removal. Legal action is extremely costly: most people would want to avoid this anyway.

Removal involves digging out the plants, rhizomes and roots attached to them, then treating the area with a strong herbicide. Even then, some roots might survive and regenerate, so vigilance will be necessary for several years. You have been warned! Think very carefully about the consequences of cultivating bamboo in your garden!

Say No To Plastic Grass

Taken from the Royal Horticultural Society's May Journal: In addition to the problems of plastic grass the EU are considering banning the use of tyre crumb on indoor and outdoor plastic grass areas due to cancer concerns and this month's RHS Journal has suggested a ban on plastic grass with support from Monty Don.

Real Grass Is Always Better - Here's Why:

- 1. Fake lawns can contaminate underlying soil and surrounding watercourses with micro -plastic fragments of nylon, polyethylene and polypropylene. The first plastic lawns were introduced to the market in 1965 as Chemgrass a much more honest name.
- 2. Real grass stores carbon. An artificial lawn leads to its release from the soil dug up and replaced with scalping such as asphalt chipping, crushed asphalt, rock or other sub-bases.
- 3. Lawn, soil and greenery cool a garden's surface and surroundings through evaporation and transpiration. Artificial grass provides none of these benefits and can become extremely hot underfoot in summer.
- Artificial grass provides no habitat for wildlife. Even closely mown grass lawns provide space for birds to dig and worms to live, while longer grass provides nectar for pollinators and places to breed, feed and lay.
- 5. Plastic lawns require replacing after a certain amount of wear and are hard to recycle. Many end up in landfill.
- 6. No daisy chain was ever made while lying on a patch of fake grass.

Phase one concept design focuses on Solihull High Street, New Road and the access to Malvern Park via Park Road.
