# **KDBH Bus Action Group**

After the KDBH Bus Action Group reached out to TfWM about our local bus services, Ryan Charlton, the new Bus Service Specialist for Solihull & Coventry, contacted us. He met with our Bus Action Group in January. Ryan showed a deep understanding of local bus services and was responsive to our concerns.

We've been facing issues on the A3 route, especially along Purnells Way, Tilehouse Green Lane, and Longdon Road. The last timetable change forced residents to walk to Station Road for the Knowle bus. This was inconvenient as the bus used to return through these roads from Knowle, but only went towards Dorridge.

Ryan was already aware of this problem and is working to adjust this part of the route. He aims to implement these changes soon. He's also focusing on the better synchronization of bus and train schedules. Additionally, he plans to improve the bus service by distributing departure times more evenly over the hour. This will help avoid the current bunching of buses from Solihull to Knowle and Dorridge.

Another concern is the congestion at Solihull bus stops. Ryan is working on strategies to reduce the number of buses at each stop, easing the congestion.

On a positive note, Landflight buses now accept contactless payments with credit/debit cards. This makes travel more convenient for many passengers. They've also made real-time bus information available via these links:

issues with local people; the KDBH Bus Action Group hope to arrange this meeting later in the year.

# National Planning Policy Framework and Local Plan Review

The long-awaited revision to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) was finally published on 19th December 2023, a year after the initial consultation was announced. This sets out the government's planning policies for England and how these are expected to be applied.

The KDBH Neighbourhood Forum had expectations for revisions in the assessment of Green Belt housing allocations by local councils. Unfortunately, the final version of the changes is less impactful than initially proposed. The Council is now evaluating how these changes might influence the Local Plan Review. This evaluation is especially relevant for the two green field sites in our area, KN1 Hampton Road and KN2 Arden Triangle, designated for housing.

# Local Plan Review Update & Major Housing Projects

## Local Plan Review Status

The Local Plan Review is currently paused. The Government Inspectors have stated that the updated National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) from December 2023 does not affect the Solihull Local Plan. The KDBH forum have asked the Council to decide how to proceed.

# **KN2 Site Developments**

Despite the pause in the Local Plan Review, two significant planning applications for the KN2 site (Arden Triangle) have been submitted. The KDBH Forum stance remains firm: they will object to any applications until a comprehensive masterplan for



the entire KN2 area is approved. Regrettably, such a master plan is not yet submitted, and they believe the KDBH Forum should be involved early in its development, not just at the community engagement stage.

## **Stripes Hill Proposals**

There are two planning submissions for Stripes Hill. The first is for an Integrated Retirement Community with up to 170 units. The second, by Cerda Planning for the Kler Group, proposes up to 450 houses and a primary school. The KDBH Forum is still awaiting a proposal for the Taylor Wimpey part of the site, potentially for around 200 houses.

## **Arden Academy Concerns**

Both applications for the KN2 site do not support the relocation of Arden Academy, a key aspect of the Solihull Local Plan. The proposed housing numbers exceed those recommended by Solihull Council, a point of major concern for the KDBH forum. The KDBH Forum has objected to the increased housing levels and the omission of a new Arden Academy, which has government funding support.

# **Dorridge Park Brook**

A post concerning the brook in Dorridge Park and accompanying photograph in local media at the end of December 2023 gave rise to over 30 responses. It appeared that the water had been contaminated with sewage and that some dogs which had entered the polluted water had become ill. The post was forwarded to DDRA who took the matter up with Councillor lan Courts. Severn Trent investigated and found no evidence of prolonged contamination. They checked the Beconsfield Close pumping station and the Grange Road combined sewer overflow and concluded that this was the result of a hydraulic event due to heavy rain. They will continue to investigate but believe that this is not a long-term pollution problem.

# **Dorridge Station Long Stay Car Park**

The payment machine in the car park behind Sainsbury's Petrol Station became operational in December 2023. It is situated in the centre of the car park and accepts coins and cards. Payment can also be made using the paybyphone app. Parking is free for 2 hours, but you must obtain a ticket from the machine or register your vehicle's presence on the app. Charges apply from Monday to Saturday.

# **Defibrillators, Bleed Kits & Training**

In 2013, DDRA acquired four defibrillator cabinets and defibrillators for the community. Quick access to a defibrillator greatly improves survival in cardiac arrest cases. The defibrillators are checked regularly by our local first responder team, FastAid, led by Terry Flower, so that they are always "rescue-ready".

Bleed Kits are now being introduced into the defibrillator cabinets. These are supplied by the WMAS and are designed to help staunch the flow of blood following a stabbing or other traumatic event, as this really helps limit the severe blood loss that can happen quite quickly. We have all read and heard of the terrible injuries inflicted by knives; this is a practical response which could save lives. If you go onto our website www.ddra. org.uk there is a video explaining the kits and how they are used in the Defibrillators, Bleed Kits & Training section.

If someone collapses, call 999 immediately. The cabinets containing defibrillators and bleed kits are registered with the West Midlands Ambulance Service (WMAS). You'll be informed if a defibrillator or bleed kit is nearby, based on the situation. You'll receive the cabinet's key code and guidance on using the equipment.

In 2014, the Bentley Heath Community Centre was at risk of closing. With the help of a grant from Veolia, some £40,000 has been spent since then in bringing the hall to its present standard. The present committee has overseen a complete modernisation of the premises and ensured it is very well patronised and financially secure. It is fully used on weekdays by local groups and classes and is usually fully booked at weekends for parties and similar events.

We feel that the hall is needed as a local resource and are keen to maintain the standards reached and it would be a shame to see it fail through lack of support - **WE NEED HELP!** 

Unfortunately, the present committee members are not getting any younger and 2014 is in danger of repeating itself if younger blood does not come forward to take over. The classes focus on strength training exercises, emphasising muscle growth and bone density. The goal? To make you feel stronger and more resilient, ready to tackle whatever comes your way. Balance is key, and that's where tailored exercises come in to improve coordination and stability, reducing the risk of falls and boosting your confidence in movement.

Richard Waterworth is a physiotherapist with over 10 years' experience rehabilitating older adults. He recently left the NHS to start these classes with the aim of offering fun, interactive but, most importantly, an effective way to regain or maintain independence. It's all about being able to continue to do the things we enjoy.

The classes have a really supportive atmosphere where everyone's progress is valued. Richard says "I understand that everyone has different levels of ability. Whether you use a frame, stick or nothing at all, everyone's welcome." He's made a pledge that all classes will always be in-person, never online.
