## Graffiti on railway pedestrian bridges

Criminal damage in the form of graffiti has become a persistent problem on the railway footbridge connecting Weston Close and Arden Drive, Dorridge, and increasingly on the footbridge at Bentley Heath Crossing. The problem has arisen since Network Rail gave both these bridges solid sides, providing a blank canvas for those intent on graffiti. Both bridges are the responsibility of Network Rail. They say obscene graffiti is dealt with as a priority, however their response times are nonetheless very slow even for this. If more local residents were to report graffiti when they see it, it might persuade Network Rail to be more responsive and more open to looking at longer term solutions.

To keep our community clean and safe, we encourage residents to promptly report any graffiti they see on these footbridges. Quick action can help to deter further vandalism and ensure that our public spaces remain welcoming and well-maintained.

### **Planning Matters**

Unfortunately, there is no progress to report at present regarding the Solihull Local Plan. The Plan remains in abeyance, although the Council has recently written again to the Inspectors to explore 'pragmatic solutions' for a resumption without the need to identify further Green Belt land releases. A reply from the Inspectors is still awaited. Given the situation with the forthcoming general election on Thursday 4th July, it would be surprising if a response were received before then. We are continuing to monitor the situation and will update you as soon as we hear anything.

### **Neighbourhood Plan Review**

The Neighbourhood Plan for KDBH was approved in April 2019 with a 96% approval vote at the referendum. We have recently reviewed the entire Plan in detail and opened initial consultations with the Council, members, and residents. We have completed a comprehensive Housing Needs Assessment, available to view on our website. While some outstanding items remain, including housing, Environmental, and Habitats Regulation assessments, once these are complete, we expect to progress to the first formal consultation stage. the Local Plan Examination. Our Neighbourhood Plan remains a 'living' document, subject to regular review and improvement, and is referenced in local planning applications.

## **Community Actions Audit**

We have undertaken an audit on the current state of Community Actions, set out in Appendix 4 of the Neighbourhood Plan. Several actions are being progressed, including resident surveys on mobile phone and broadband usage, roads, footpaths, signs, and cycling issues, as well as an audit of our heritage assets. The Council has launched a borough-wide review of such assets. If you have comments on buildings or local features of interest that should be protected, please respond to the Council. A list of current heritage assets locally is detailed in Appendix 5 of the Neighbourhood Plan, available on our website: (https://www.kdbh-np.org).

## **Funding for Neighbourhood CIL Projects**

We are hopeful to hear about available funding pots for Neighbourhood CIL (NCIL) projects within July. These funds may offset the adverse effects of development in the Knowle and Dorridge (including Bentley Heath) Wards. We are optimistic for good news to build on the success of previous years, where projects totalling over £200,000 have provided tangible benefits to our community.
