

World Cup of Stations 2024

The annual World Cup of Stations competition, organised by Rail Delivery Group, was established in 2019 to celebrate great stations across the UK. The competition challenges carefully shortlisted stations - this year, 48 of them - to battle it out head-to-head in an online public vote. Each year there is a special emphasis, and this year's competition celebrated the variety of local businesses in and around railway stations and the benefits they bring to their communities and economies.

Small businesses are the heart and soul of train stations up and down the country, playing a vital role in serving their local communities, regular commuters and day trippers on a daily basis, and creating job opportunities

Our station in Dorridge is certainly to be celebrated and treasured, and we are fortunate to have an excellent station master in Fraser Carter, and, as highlighted in the last DDRA newsletter, the waiting room and entrance foyer underwent a beautiful transformation. But the business that in particular was being highlighted in this year's entry was the station's café, Espresso, an independent coffee shop serving artisan coffee and food all day, including freshly baked pastries, made-to-order paninis, and toasties, amongst other menu delights.

Dorridge Station made it through the preliminary rounds all the way to the final on Friday 18th October, where, during the course of the day, a tense, nail-biting battle took place between Dorridge, Maghull (Merseyside) and King's Lynn (Norfolk). At 9.00 p.m. the voting progress was hidden, and everyone was kept in suspense until Friday 25th October when the results were announced.

And sadly, we were pipped at the post by Maghull! However, we would like to thank everyone who voted – it was a valiant effort. Congratulations to Maghull, and who knows, maybe we will try again next year!

participants of Sarah's Zumba & Zumba Gold classes, were there to mark the occasion.

A defibrillator like this, ready & available for community access, can make the difference between life & death. Its prompt use can double the chance of someone's survival.

Dorridge & District Residents' Association have funded 4 community defibrillators in our area for over 10 years now. They are in various locations: on the walls at the butcher's in Bentley Heath (was Vernon James, now Eric Lyons), Bentley Heath Community Centre, Dorridge Village Hall and outside Sainsbury's supermarket in the centre of Dorridge.

Each defibrillator is kept in a protective cabinet on an outside wall, so that it is available 24/7. They are linked into the West Midlands Ambulance Service's Circuit and each one is accessed by keycode, which is given when an emergency 999 call is made; the ambulance service will be able to locate the defibrillator nearest to where the call is coming from.

Local Community First Responders from FastAid regularly check that the device is rescue-ready & are also notified when it is used.

Our next free Heartstart (Basic Life Support & Defibrillator Training) session is taking place at Dorridge Village Hall on Friday 29th November, 7-9 p.m.

The aim of the session is to help you to know what to do if you see someone collapse.

Buses could be under local control by 2027

Bus services across the West Midlands could be under public control by 2027, the mayor has announced. The proposed franchise model would allow Transport for West Midlands (TfWM) to control routes, timetables, fares, and service standards. A final decision is expected by March 2025, following an independent audit and public consultation later this year, with an estimated transition cost of £22m.

Labour mayor, Richard Parker, who campaigned on this policy, said: "Our buses are failing. The West Midlands is paying an additional £50m subsidy every year to private operators, and yet they increase prices and cut services year-on-year... This has to change."

Under the franchise model, bus companies would bid for contracts, but TfWM would decide on key details like fares and schedules. If approved, the transition will take two years, affecting services across Wolverhampton, Birmingham, Solihull, and Coventry. TfWM is working with bus operators to maintain services during the transition, though some changes to routes and services are expected from January, as current subsidy agreements with operators expire at the end of December.

Dorridge Railway Station refurbishments

The new information screen at the side entrance of the station is now up and running! This is a valuable resource for those using the car park and entering the station from that direction.

Refurbishment work is also scheduled for both the gents' and ladies' toilets, and there are plans to lift and refit the flooring in the waiting room on Platform 2 and 3, which has been affected by flooding on at least two occasions.

Fraser also wanted to give thanks for the community's support during the World Cup of Stations. It has been absolutely incredible and makes him very proud, so thank you all for your continued enthusiasm and involvement.

the station, and the smaller area on Grange Road opposite Station Approach, under the aegis of the DDRA.

The Station Approach area is on quite a steep slope, so soil slowly spills on to the pavement on Station Approach. Plants put near the border are also vulnerable to people treading on them. One way to reduce soil spillage would be to put raised edging along the demarcation line of the soil bed between it and the pavement. This is along the boundary between land owned by Network Rail and the pavement owned by the Council, so both would need to give permission.

The two benches along the Station Approach slope need either refurbishment, if possible, or replacing. DDRA is happy to support this scheme in principle, as it will be helpful to our team of gardeners and help to make the areas more sustainable in the long run.

In September, a small group of DDRA committee members and people from the Gardening Group met with our supportive local Councillor Sally Tomlinson, and Sarah Ashford, the Visit Solihull Manager from the Economy & Infrastructure Directorate at Solihull Council, to discuss these ideas. Sarah is currently waiting to hear back from Chiltern Railways/ Network Rail, but in the meantime is arranging for some planter tubs to be put on the pavement at the corner of Grange Road and Station Approach to cheer up the area and discourage parking of cars on the pavements there.

Solihull Council scrap local plan

Solihull's local plan has been withdrawn after a heated Full Council meeting on October 8th. Councillors voted to scrap the current plan and start again, following a recommendation from the Planning Inspectorate due to a shortfall in available land for development.

The plan, which has faced delays since 2022, has encountered several challenges, including disagreements over housing numbers and land supply, as well as legal battles and changes in government policies. In December 2023, the previous government said councils didn't need to alter Green Belt boundaries to meet housing targets. However, the new Labour government is proposing changes that would require councils to release Green Belt land to meet housing needs.

In addition to meeting its own housing targets, Solihull must also help neighbouring areas that don't have enough land for their housing requirements. Work on creating a new local plan will begin immediately.
