

Knowle United Charity traces its origins back to the 17th Century and over the last 300 years, the Charity has been providing benefits to people in the Ecclesiastical Parishes of St. John the Baptist, Knowle; St. Philip's, Dorridge; St. Swithin's, Barston; and the Civil Parish of Balsall Common & Chadwick End.

A brief history

The Charity is made up of a number of small trusts and bequests set up by benevolent local donors over the last 300 years. Some names are easily recognised as part of Knowle today, such as the Hon Sarah and Algernon Greville (c1710), Richard Grimshaw (c1691) and others who are less familiar including Fulke, Lord Brooke (c1694) and Reverend William Wilson (c1832).

The sixteen small Trusts were amalgamated and later merged with Knowle Educational Charity to become Knowle United Charity, a Charitable Incorporated Organisation in 2016 (CIO No.1166099). Twelve Trustees administer the Charity with the Clerk who manages the day to day business.

The Trustees are able to consider applications for grants for the relief of need and for the promotion of educational purposes within the areas as specified in the Charity's Constitution.

Previous grants

In the past five years, grants totalling between £75,000 and £120,000 a year have been made by Knowle United Charity. These include grants to individuals in need, as well as to schools, playgroups, churches and contributions to support Youth Ministers, local sheltered accommodation and community schemes to benefit vulnerable groups. Significant grants totalling £120,000 were made to local schools over two years to support the needs of pupils during the COVID restrictions.

Support for students

Educational grants, currently averaging £400 a year, are offered to school leavers over 18 years whose home is within the Charity's specified areas, to assist them in further education. These grants are offered to students towards the cost of books, computer equipment, travel or the cost of accommodation during their studies at university or college. Applications may also be considered for special travel projects taken for a charitable purpose. Eligible students for the academic year 2024-5 can request an application form from our clerk and completed applications for consideration should be received the clerk by 30th October.

Local interests

The Charity owns the land on which Knowle Primary Academy Junior School is built and has for many years made grants to support the school. The Charity also owns 22 properties of various types and sizes in the village of Knowle and these are rented to people of limited means who have a close connection to Knowle at the time of their application. The Charity does not retain a waiting list and vacancies are advertised locally when any property becomes

Rail Fare Increases and Ticket Changes from 2nd March 2025

Rail fares increased on 2nd March 2025, with several ticket changes affecting travel from Dorridge to London and Birmingham. Thanks to Fraser Carter for information around the following:

London Fares:

Peak return is now £148.40, off-peak return £63.60, and super off-peak return £40.00. The family ticket (return within one month) has been withdrawn. The Family Day Travelcard, which requires at least one adult and one child (up to a maximum of two adults and four children), is now £39 per adult and £1 per child. The Chiltern Duo Day Return is now £60.

Both the Family Day Travelcard and the Chiltern Duo tickets are no longer available for purchase on the day of travel. These must now be bought in advance of your planned travel date.

Full details of ticket time restrictions can be found on the Chiltern website or by asking a member of staff at the station.

Birmingham Fares:

A single ticket now costs £5.50, with a peak return at £9.50 and an off-peak return at £6.80. The Network One Day ticket is £11, while the Off-Peak Daytripper is £8.80. Season tickets have also increased, with a seven-day pass now £33.90 and a 28-day pass £114.

In addition, all one-year railcards (except for the Disabled Railcard) have risen to $\mathfrak L35$.

Local history spotlight

In Milton Close, Bentley Heath, standing on its edge in a circle of crazy paving, is a large millstone. This marks the site of the old Bentley Heath Mill, ensuring that a small slice of local history is not

forgotten. The mill was built in the late 1820s on raised heathland off Mill Lane (then called Bentley Heath Road). It was 3 storeys high with a cap, four sails and 2 pairs of stones for grinding. For 60 years it relied on wind power alone, but by 1888 a steam engine had been fitted for use on windless days.

In 1896 steam became the sole source of power and the sails were removed, and eventually the miller switched to oil. The mill reached the end of its working life in 1927 when the final miller in its history died, and all the machinery was removed. The remains of the mill and outbuildings were demolished in 1960 when the land was used for housing. Knowle Fun Run: Sunday, 18th May, 2025

Please bring a bag for your belongings, as they remain your responsibility during the event. All finishers will receive a certificate of achievement.

Knowle's Party in the Park is back for 2025


