News from the DDRA AGM

At our AGM on 19th March 2025 at Ye Olde Knowle Bowling Club, we welcomed a strong turnout of residents and visitors from Knowle, Dorridge, Bentley Heath and surrounding villages. Unsurprisingly, most were eager to hear more about the planned housing developments set to affect our area - particularly the major proposal known as the Arden Triangle.

Aside from a brief recap of the committee's work, finances, and the retirement of Kevin Kane Brooks, the evening focused on expansion plans for the three villages.

The most significant of these is the Arden Triangle - a large site south of Knowle, bounded by Grove Road, Old Warwick Road, and Station Road, with Arden Academy to the north. Plans include a substantial number of homes and a new educational facility.

Representatives from DDRA, KDBH, and the B93 Facebook group were joined by local residents and three Solihull councillors: Ian Courts, Andy Mackiewicz, and Sally Tomlinson.

Roger Cook of KDBH gave an overview of the site and explained the pressure being placed on local councils by the central government. The message was clear: if local authorities don't allocate land for development, the government will intervene, including the reclassification of some Green Belt land as "Grey Belt" where it's not being used 'effectively'.

Councillors Courts and Mackiewicz echoed this concern. And while no formal applications had been submitted at the time of the meeting, two have now been received:

Taylor Wimpey site: PL/2025/00155/PPOL

Kier site: PL/2023/02294/PPOL

Among the various documents, the Design & Access Statement is often the most helpful. It outlines the design rationale, proposed materials, how the site will be used, and how it fits into its surroundings - all in relatively accessible language. However, current statements deal with individual sites in isolation, without considering how neighbouring proposals might affect one another.

Construction is expected to cause considerable disruption. Issues such as access routes, congestion on Knowle High Street, narrow roads near the sites, and the low bridge in Dorridge are all cause for concern.

Concerns raised over scale of future housing

As reported above, the Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath (KDBH) Neighbourhood Forum has raised concerns about the scale of new housing developments being proposed in the area. According to Forum Chair Roger Cook, more than 1,700 homes are now in the pipeline, significantly more than the 808 previously expected by 2036 under the withdrawn Local Plan.

In Knowle alone, this represents an increase of around 30 percent. Proposed developments include several large sites from major developers such as Inspired Villages, Taylor Wimpey, Kier Group and Gardner Land. These are spread across key locations such as the Arden Triangle, Hampton Road and Blue Lake Road.

The Forum has noted that recent changes to national planning policy, including the relaxation of Green Belt protections, are contributing to the pace and scale of development. There is particular concern that the cumulative impact of these proposals could overwhelm the character and infrastructure of the area.

How you can help

Given the scale of current proposals, local engagement is more important than ever. You can support the Forum's work in a number of ways:

- Join the KDBH Neighbourhood Forum to stay up to date and contribute to local responses.
- Contact your local councillors or MP to share your views on recent changes to planning policy and their potential impact.
- Encourage others in the area to get involved by spreading awareness of the issues raised.

Even small actions can help to ensure that the character and infrastructure of our area are not overlooked in future planning decisions.

Meanwhile, the KDBH Neighbourhood Forum continues to monitor planning applications and highlight local views at all appropriate stages of the planning process.

Love Gate Lane

My name is Gate Lane, a quaint and essential part of most of our daily lives. Most residents know me, use me, and appreciate me. But do you love me as I deserve?

This vista of rural beauty greets us like a warm hug. It is like stepping into our own 'Secret Garden' when travelling to or from the M42 corridor - a breathtaking moment to pause, hold, and cherish. It is the gateway to and from Four Ashes, Dorridge, Bentley Heath and beyond.

Sadly, over time, this jewel in the crown became tarnished. The lane became strewn with litter along its entire length, and in numerous places the ditches were choked with fly-tipping.

Two local residents decided to reverse this decline and are determined to restore Gate Lane to the beautiful country lane it once was. Since the end of February this year, they have spent 35 hours cleaning up the lane and have collected a staggering 33 full 'Love Solihull Green' sacks. They have also reported numerous fly-tipping incidents to the relevant authorities.

This is still very much a work in progress and every day new litter appears!

An application was recently submitted and granted for local funding to purchase native plants which will enhance the verges and support local wildlife and bee populations. It is hoped that, if the lane looks beautiful and well cared for, people will think twice before dropping litter.

Planting will begin in autumn 2025, with further work planned for spring 2026. it where possible. The DDRA currently has about 400 members, who pay £4 each per year. At present, there are only 6 of us on the DDRA committee. We meet about every 6 weeks to discuss local issues and think about how we might address them.

- We produce a local newsletter 3 times a year; this is delivered by a team of volunteers to over 4.000 houses in the Dorridge. Bentley Heath and Four Ashes area. The newsletter is funded by local advertisers.
- · We maintain 4 local defibrillators and facilitate local training sessions in CPR run by our local first responders once or twice a
- We organise the annual Christmas Lights switch-on at the Bentley Heath shops; this attracts a sizeable crowd and there is a good family atmosphere.
- · We support a team of gardening volunteers who look after some of the planting in Dorridge and Bentley Heath village centres.
- · We monitor local planning applications, liaising with the KDBH Forum about larger proposals.

This is all good, but we could really do with some more people with ideas and energy to enable us to do all this and more. Please give it some thought. If you have ideas for our local community, and are prepared to help make them happen, we'd love to hear from you!


Dorridge Village Hall Association needs you!

Spotlight on History: Dorridge Station

Without Dorridge station, the extended village of Dorridge would not be the place it is today! Until the station was built, Dorridge was farmland divided between a number of tenants in large fields and small plots. The Muntz family of Umberslade Hall were local landowners who sold some of their land for the construction of the railway, with the proviso that a station or halt had to be built at Dorridge, in spite of its tiny population. This provided a direct link to London from Birmingham's Snow Hill

The original station was built by the Great Western Railway after an inspection by the Birmingham and Oxford Junction Railway and was opened for passengers on 1st October 1852. The resident engineer for the B&OJR at the time of building in the mid-19th century was Isambard Brunel, and the original station architecture was typical of other stations built by him, with semicircular brick arches over doors and windows in an Italian style, and a low roof which extended over the platform. A signal box quickly followed, together with a goods yard and shed. Although the village of Knowle was about 2 miles away it was initially named Knowle Station, renamed Knowle and Dorridge Station in 1899, and eventually (after a few years of reverting to just Knowle Station) it was renamed as Dorridge Station in 1974.

As elsewhere, the railway injected new life into the area from the outset and gave rise to much development of businesses, residential buildings and community facilities. A horse bus transported residents from the Greswolde Inn, Knowle, to the station - a journey of 20 minutes at a fare of six pence! Between 1932 and 1933 the station was extensively remodelled as part of the quadrupling of the Birmingham main line, with new platforms and station buildings being provided (as well as a new larger 74-lever signal box, replacement of the - now demolished - goods shed and vard, and more).

The station buildings we see today have retained many of the original features, with a traditional GWR 'feel', in spite of the loss of the 1930s roof and platform canopies. A sad event occurred on 15th August 1963, when, due to a signalling error, a collision between an express train and a freight train resulted in the deaths of three express train crew thankfully the only such incident in Dorridge Station's history. Expansion of the area has increased over the years and Dorridge is no longer just 'a railway village', but nevertheless. Dorridge Station still retains its character and its deservedly distinctive place at the heart of the 'village'.

Solihull Council has announced that from Monday 7th July 2025, garden waste collections will no longer be free. If you would like to continue having your garden waste collected, you will need to subscribe to the service and pay a fee. Once you've subscribed, you'll receive a permit sticker to place on your green bin.

Bins without a valid sticker will not be emptied. Subscriptions are valid from July 2025 to June 2026.

A buzzing success at Bentley Heath Park

Back in early May, Bentley Heath Park welcomed a charming new addition - a bug hotel, carefully designed and built by the Eco Committee of Bentley Heath Primary School. Officially opened by the Mayor of Solihull on Friday 9th May, the project brought together pupils, staff, contractors from Veolia, and the Love Solihull team for a celebration of nature, community, and creativity.

The children's enthusiasm was clear from the moment the ribbon was cut. After admiring their handiwork, they helped to scatter 0.5 kg of wildflower seeds across the soil behind the bug hotel. The seeds were tamped down by the pupils themselves, and over the past few weeks, helped along by the rain, those efforts have begun to take root.

Now, as we move into summer, the wildflower area is coming to life, creating a colourful, pollinator-friendly backdrop to the bug hotel. It's a small but meaningful contribution to local biodiversity and a lovely enhancement to this much-loved green space.

Projects like this are a reminder of what can be achieved when the community comes together and how even the smallest structures can have a big impact.

Solihull Council continues to maintain over 1.1 million square metres of meadows, wildlife corridors and conservation areas across the borough, including its 17 Green Flag Award-winning parks.
