Bentley Heath Primary School has proudly been named an Outstanding Conservation School 2025 by Chester Zoo, recognising the school's exceptional efforts in wildlife conservation and sustainability education.

The award, announced this summer, highlights schools that go above and beyond in inspiring young people to care for the natural world. Bentley Heath particularly impressed judges with its new Conservation Area including eco-classroom made from old plastic bottles, student-led wildlife and gardening projects, and strong community involvement in environmental action. Of particular interest also, was the 'bug hotel' in Bentley Heath Park that was built by children and unveiled by the Mayor earlier this year.

I am happy to say that the Polar Express trains will run every Saturday and Sunday from 22nd November to 21st December, as well as on 22nd and 23rd December. Timetables are not yet confirmed so keep your eyes peeled!

Also please note that the Birmingham Christmas Market begins on 1st November, and trains from Birmingham, especially in the evenings, are expected to be much busier than usual. Plan ahead where possible. Thanks for your continued care for our lovely station and feel free to pop in for a chat any time.

Action Required Now

In July's newsletter, we highlighted the unprecedented number of housing developments being proposed for Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath. While new homes are an expected part of growth, the scale of what is being put forward is deeply concerning. Our area is being asked to take on a disproportionate number of new homes compared to the rest of the Borough.

Bloor Homes is now proposing up to 350 houses on land bordered by Blue Lake Road, Knowle Wood Road and Grove Road in Dorridge. The resulting congestion and pressure on local infrastructure would be significant, and the character of our area would be permanently altered.

This is in addition to the Arden Triangle development featured in our last edition. Many feel it is only reasonable to understand the impact of that scheme before adding further strain to the community.

A local action group has now been formed, led by residents and supported by professional advisors, to oppose this application as effectively as possible. Membership is growing, but more support is urgently needed. A6: Withdrawn

A7: Increased to every 30 minutes and re-routed via Purnells Way and Longdon Road replacing A6

A8: Increased to every 30 minutes and re-routed via Purnells Way and Longdon Road replacing A6

A9: Withdrawn between Blythe Valley and Solihull, Solihull to Kingshurst now operated by Diamond bus.

From January 4th 2026:

73: Solihull to Heartlands Hospital - Withdrawn

A9: Solihull to Kingshurst - Withdrawn

98: New service Solihull to Heartlands Hospital via Lyndon every 30 minutes

99: New service Solihull to Kingshurst via Lyndon, Sheldon every 30 minutes

98/99: Combine to a new 15 minute frequency between Solihull and Lyndon/Sheldon

These changes will simplify the network and increase frequencies and hours of operation where possible. The 118 goes from Solihull to Coventry, passing through Bentley Heath, Dorridge, Knowle and Balsall Common. In September there was a fairly sudden change to the timetable, due to congestion and HS2-related roadworks. The updated timetable is now on the DDRA website but the timetables at the bus stops have not yet been updated, which is very misleading. We have asked that this be done as soon as possible.

The new timetables for the **118** and **A7/A8** services are all on the DDRA website *ddra.org.uk*. The **118** is operated by Stagecoach; the **A7/A8** are operated by Landflight.

KDBH Planning Update: Town vs. Village – A Strategy to Protect the Green Belt

Government planning policy is changing and introducing the concept of 'Grey Belt', which refers to Green Belt land judged to be less critical and therefore easier to release for development. A key loophole states that strong Green Belt protections only

apply to land preventing the merger of towns, not villages. As long as KDBH is classed as a village, the surrounding Green Belt is considered weakly protected and at risk of being redesignated as Grey Belt.

To prevent this, the Neighbourhood Forum and Solihull Council propose to classify Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath, with a population close to 20,000, as a single town for planning purposes. This strengthens the Green Belt's status by clearly defining it as the land preventing towns from merging, which triggers the highest level of protection.

Reclassification also means that if development does occur, it must follow strict "Golden Rules" which require meaningful affordable housing and legally binding infrastructure investment through Section 106 agreements.

This strategy aims to protect local character while ensuring any change brings real community benefit rather than uncontrolled sprawl.
